The RCMP Victim Services Program has been operating in Alberta since the early 1980's. The creation of this program was a direct result of a rapidly growing trend in Alberta and across the country to create a program which would, first and foremost, serve the needs of victims of crime or tragedy, during their involvement in the criminal justice system.

The purpose of the Victim Services Program is to lessen the impact and trauma on a victim, and provide information, assistance and referrals. It is widely known that if a person who has experienced trauma or tragedy receives intervention shortly after the incident, the length of time required to return to a normal level of functioning is greatly lessened. This is the ultimate goal of the Victim Support.

The mission of Victim Services Program is to provide support, information and referral to victims of crime and tragedy. They are available 24 hours a day and 365 days a year, to respond to any person whom crime and tragedy has unwillingly intruded upon. This may include someone who has been sexually assaulted, harassed, beaten, robbed, or has experienced the sudden death of a loved one. We provide compassion, a listening ear, and direction on where to go and what to do in the days to come. We may accompany a victim to court, assist them with entering a shelter, or sit with them while they grieve.

Advocates will also assist people in completing the Victim Impact Statement, Restitution Requests and Financial Benefits applications. The society strives to ensure that all victims of all incidents are fully aware of all available assistance.
